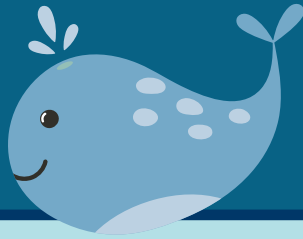

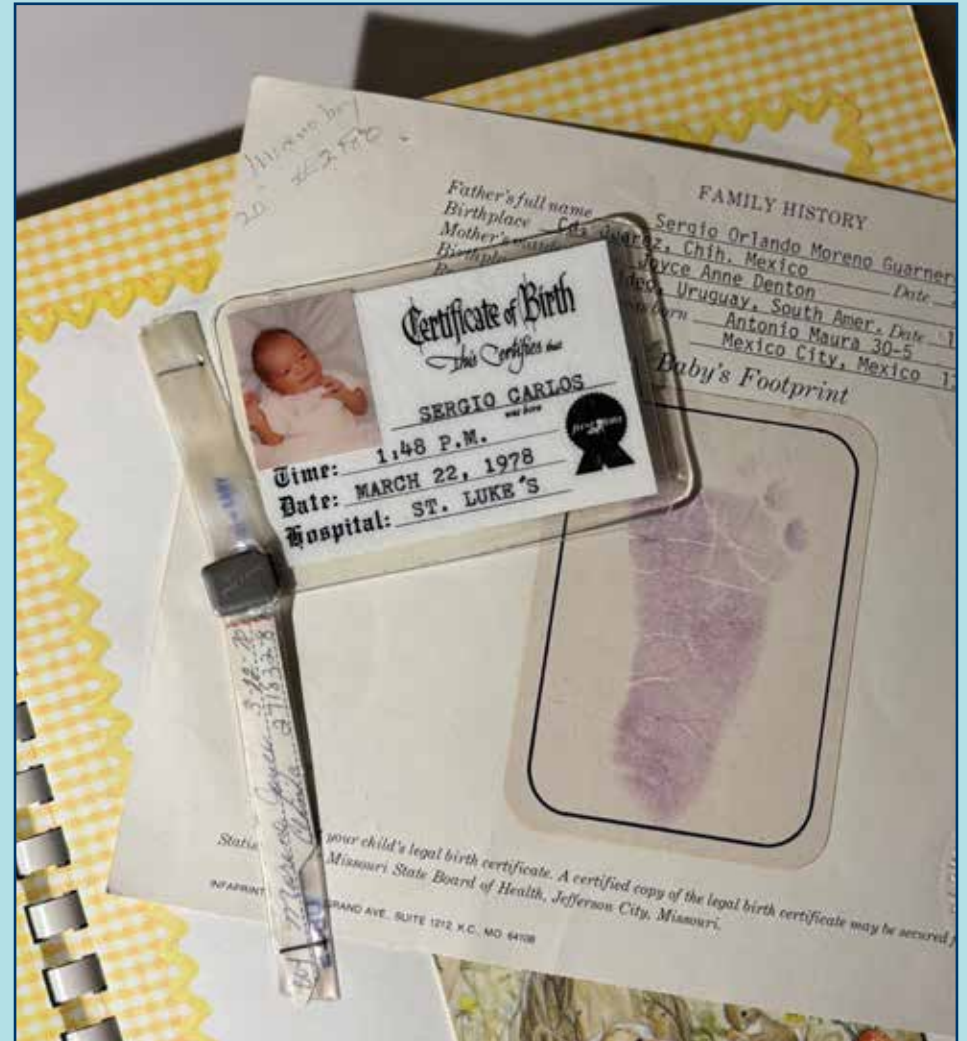
2023



Kolson was born at Saint Luke's North Hospital in 2023, weighing in at 9+ pounds with a full head of dark, black hair.

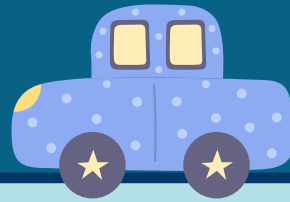
First Memories

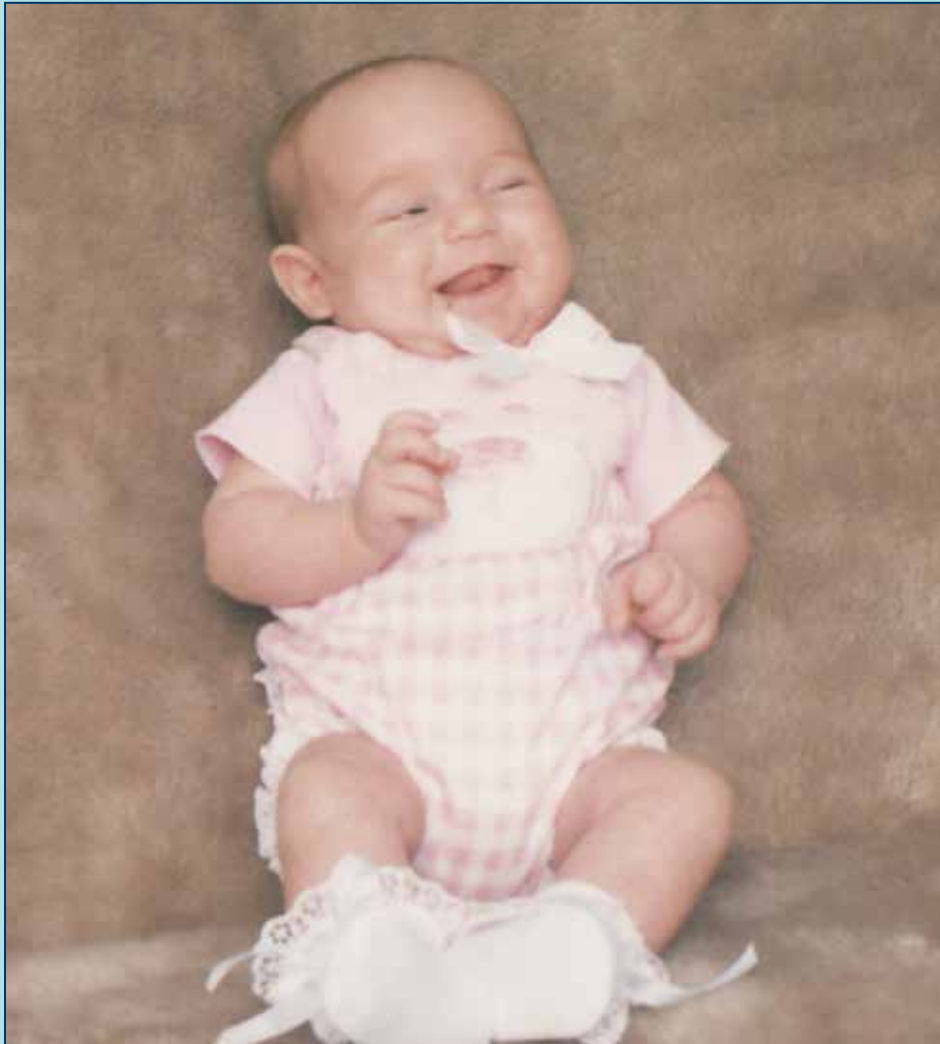
Sweet Baby

Baby Elisabeth's mom thought it was special to deliver at Saint Luke's Hospital of Kansas City after being born there herself in 1989.

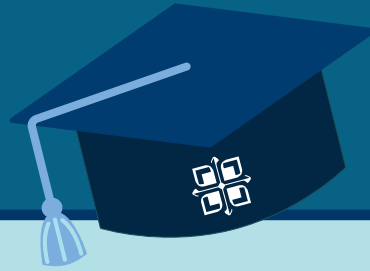

Sweet Baby



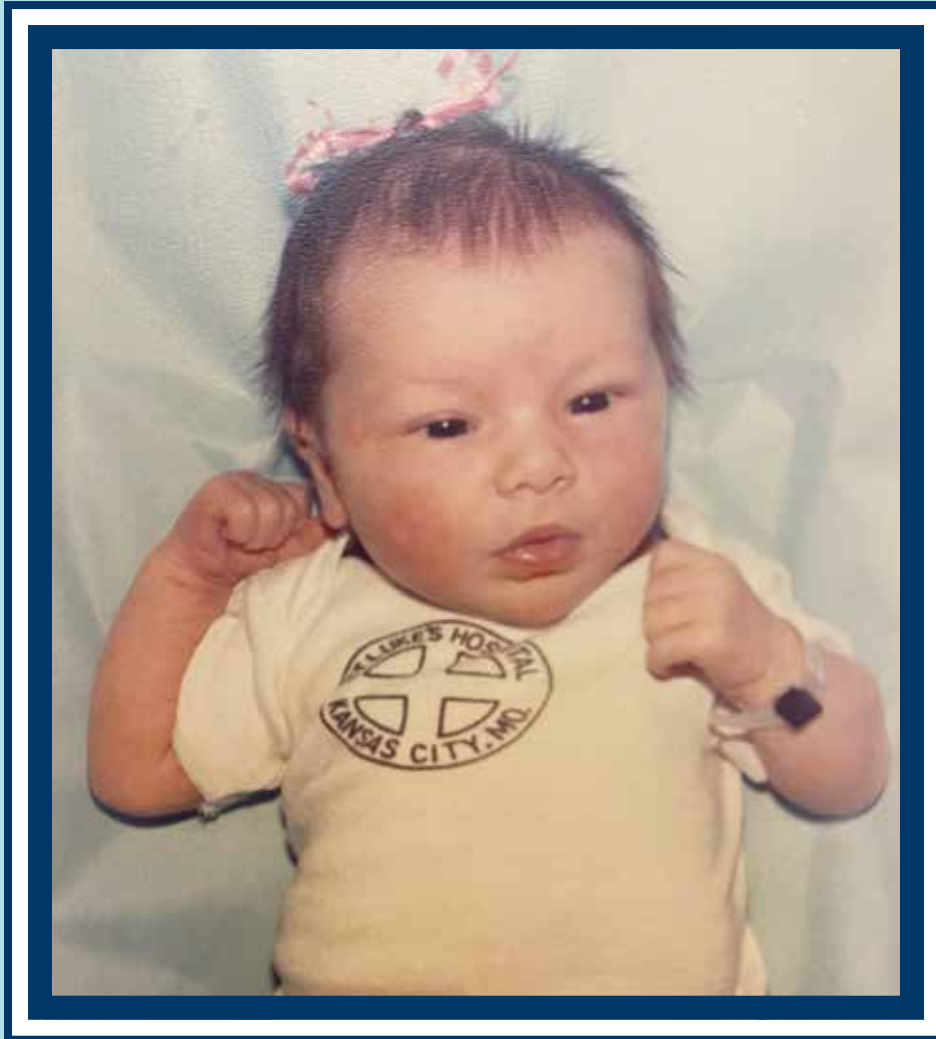
2023

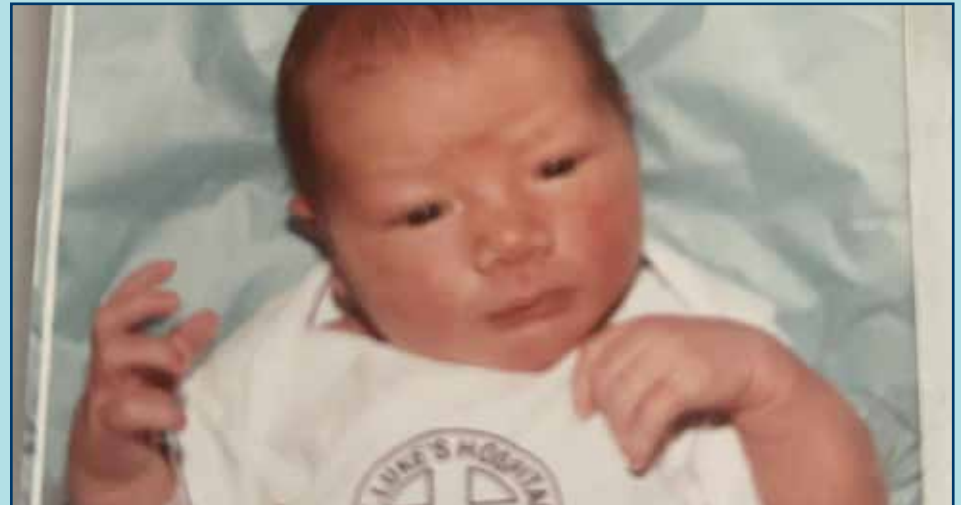
2023

Saint Luke's babies and their families have played a super role in supporting the Kansas City Chiefs in their pursuit of championships.





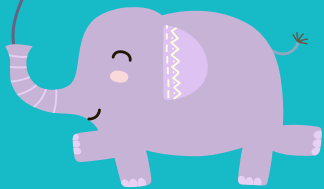
Saint Luke's celebrated the start of the Women's World Cup by enlisting some new, little soccer recruits.
