#### **Culinary Corner**



When Maryanne (see Resident Reveal, p. 7) moved to the RLC, she brought her cherished recipes with her, including this classic. She remembers finding the recipe for chocolate mayonnaise cake in the local newspaper sometime in the 1950s, and it's been a family favorite ever since.

There are many different stories as to the recipe's origin, but having an easy swap for eggs, butter, and oil surely came in handy at times. And there's also some fun to be had with the daring ingredient—mayonnaise—that continues to intrigue bakers (and tasters) alike!

1 Tbsp baking soda

1 cup mayonnaise

1 cup water

#### Chocolate Mayonnaise Cake

#### Ingredients

1 cup flour

¾ cup sugar

¼ cup baking cocoa

1 Tbsp baking powder

#### Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- **2.** In a large bowl, combine the dry ingredients. Add the mayonnaise and water and whisk together until smooth.
- **3.** Pour batter into a greased 9 x 13 baking pan. Bake for 20 25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center of the cake comes out clean.
- **4.** Let cake cool completely. Ice with French vanilla or caramel frosting.

mental, physical, emotional, spiritual, social, and environmental," shared Abby Kellerman, Activity Coordinator. "We want residents to have a variety of activities to choose from and also offer new experiences that keep them active, engaged, and happy."

Residents recently voted to gather for devotional readings each morning. They also suggested the excursion to the Topeka Zoo and plan to do canning this summer. One resident shared a recipe for her favorite homemade pickles.

"A key focus this year has been to increase our community engagement," said Abby. "This includes getting residents out into the community and also inviting visitors into our home."



Residents have enjoyed going out to lunch at the Dutch Country Cafe and visiting the Garnett Public Library and Walker Art Gallery, while the local farmers market and county fair top the list of seasonal attractions. Residents who are not able to participate in outings benefit from visitors coming into the community, including musical guests and the petting zoo. Family bingo night has also been a wildly popular activity. It's a fun way for residents to socialize with visitors of all ages.

"We're always looking for new opportunities to enrich the lives of our residents," said Abby. "If you have any ideas for an activity or outing our residents would enjoy, I'd love to hear about it."
